Each year, thousands of pilgrims travel to Lourdes to pray, to seek healing, and to place their hopes and struggles in the loving hands of Our Lady. Among them is our own **Arundel and Brighton Diocese Pilgrimage**, a beautiful expression of **faith, service, and community** that brings together people of all ages and backgrounds.

Lourdes is not just a destination, it's an experience. It is a place where **prayer** fills the air, where candlelight processions move **hearts**, and where the presence of **Mary gently draws people closer to her Son**. For many pilgrims, Lourdes becomes a **turning point in their faith journey**: a place of deep peace, honest prayer, and unexpected joy.

At the heart of our diocesan pilgrimage are the young volunteers: Red Shirts and Purple Shirts. These young people give their time, energy, and compassion to support pilgrims who are sick, elderly, or living with disabilities. From pushing wheelchairs and assisting at meals to sharing conversations and laughter, Red Shirts and Purple Shirts play a vital role in making Lourdes a place of dignity, care, and friendship.

If you are a young person wondering whether to volunteer, know this: Lourdes will change you. You will serve others, but you will also be served in ways you don't expect. You will pray in powerful and simple ways, form friendships that last a lifetime, and discover gifts within yourself that you may not yet know are there. It is hard work, yes – but it is also full of fun, meaning, and moments that stay with you forever.

Being a Red or Purple Shirt is not about having all the answers or being “perfect.” It's about showing up with an open heart, a willing spirit, and a readiness to love. Lourdes teaches us that holiness is often found in small acts: a smile, a helping hand, a shared prayer.

If you're looking for an adventure that is both **exciting** and deeply **prayerful**, a chance to make a **real difference** while **growing in faith**, then consider joining the Arundel and Brighton Diocese Pilgrimage. Lourdes is waiting, and so are the people whose lives you might touch, and who will surely touch yours.

Walking the Way of the Cross | *Turning our hearts and minds towards Lent...*

Lent invites us into holy ground. It is not simply a season of giving things up, but a time of turning back, of allowing our hearts and minds to be re-oriented toward God. Few devotions help us do this as powerfully, or as simply, as the Stations of the Cross.

When we pray the Stations, we walk with Jesus in His final hours. We linger where the world would rather rush past: suffering, injustice, weakness, compassion, love poured out to the end. Each station holds up a mirror to our own lives, our failures and fears, but also our capacity for faithfulness, mercy, and hope. In tracing Christ's path to Calvary, we are gently invited to ask: *Where am I in this story? Where is Christ carrying the cross for me, and where is He asking me to help carry it for others?*

The Stations of the Cross slow us down in a world that prizes speed and distraction. They teach us to pray not only with words, but with our bodies and our attention - with silence, movement, and reflection. Over the weeks of Lent, this repeated prayer shapes us, softens us, and prepares us for the great mysteries of the Triduum. By the time we stand at the foot of the Cross on Good Friday, and later before the empty tomb at Easter, our hearts have already been led there, step by step.

This Lent, consider making the Stations of the Cross a regular part of your journey. Join us each **Friday evening at 7:00 pm** at St Thomas More Church, as we gather to pray together. Come whether you are carrying heavy burdens or simply longing for deeper stillness. Come to walk with Christ, and with one another, toward the Cross, trusting that this road, though marked by suffering, always leads to resurrection.
